In a few days we will be entering the season of Lent. In the grand scheme of things, Lent is a fairly new concept for protestant churches. Many of us grew up with Catholic friends who gave up something for Lent, or who fasted on Fridays during Lent. But I can speak for myself in saying that I never really understood how those things brought people closer to God. Most of the time it just seemed to make them uncomfortable and grumpy.

As an adult I have tried to embrace the concept of Lent at it's core. You see, we protestants have been accused of being unwilling to be uncomfortable for Christ, and while I don't think we need to participate in self flagellation, I do think we need to figure out ways to be more present to all of life's situations and conditions.

And so, I invite you to consider some things about the season of Lent. First of all, it is meant to be a time when we grow in our understanding of just how far God is willing to go to be in relationship with us. God wanted to be in relationship with us so much that Emmanuel, 'God with us,' came to experience this life. Above all else Lent is a time for us to realize that God's love is so vast that we cannot always make sense of it.

Secondly, Lent is a time for us to think about how we will respond to that love. What things are getting in the way of realizing that love? What things could we add to our lives that will help us realize it more? Think about taking away gossip, or giving up your need to right, or buying things you know you don't need. Or if you are more about addition than subtraction, think about adding five minutes of prayer a day, or one verse of scripture. Think about adding five minutes of positive conversation with a loved one, or a perfect stranger. Examine your life as it is and think about ways that you can bring yourself closer to God's love.

Finally, Lent is a time to be comfortable with the uncomfortable. Our Christian story doesn't God from birth to resurrection. A lot happens in the middle and the stories in between don't always show humanity in a positive light. Lent is a time when we can remember our Christian stories of betrayal, denial and outright persecution and then think about how those things show up in our daily lives and how we have participated in them ourselves. We don't have to fix it, but recognizing our involvement and asking for forgiveness will help us in our journey towards healing.

When taken seriously, Lent is not the easiest six weeks of your life, but it can be incredibly meaningful. I am glad to be on this journey with you, and look forward to seeing where it leads.
